



COVID Risk Assessment

Following the relaxation of the National Guidelines associated with the COVID-19 pandemic, we thought it would be worth outlining our intentions for the rest of the school year.

Whilst we are now in a position where we could relax some of our systems and processes, we have taken the decision to keep things as they are until the end of the school year.

This is because the pupils are familiar with the expectations and the way in which things are organised, and changing things now may actually create greater uncertainty, especially if a reversal is required. As such, we will be watching closely how things develop over the coming months and will be

planning for a return to something much closer to normality in September, presuming that nothing has changed in terms of the level of risk.

Having said that, we will be looking to reintroduce class swimming after half term, possibly on a two weekly basis as we make sure that there is sufficient time to clean the pool area thoroughly between uses. We will also be looking to arrange some trips off site for classes as we begin to make greater use of the community for educational purposes once again.
