Review of FWS definition of bullying

- Half of the councillors attended the meeting to review the school's definition of bullying.
- Generally, the councillors felt they knew what bullying was and that it was not a good thing. They knew that bullying is when someone is unkind and it happens again and again. They gave examples... "saying nasty words" "doing horrible things" "mean" "unkind" "breaking things"
- All councillors talked about their understanding of bullying with the group, and some shared their own experiences of bullying.
- The councillors agreed on what they thought were important positive behaviours within their own class...





















- The councillors considered the current school definition bullying and reflected on what they feel needed to change.... (see definition attached)
 - · Include positive behaviour and describe what a good friend is like
 - Add 'getting into your personal space' in to the examples
 - Clarify 'ridicule' so that it is clear it means nasty jokes and not nice ones
- The council decided that it would be a good idea to make posters to explain to everyone what bullying is and how we can help to stop it. They would like as many classes as possible to make a poster to display around school.





- It was suggested that the wooded area and wildlife garden (behind GC) could do with a tidy up so if any pupils are interested in doing that, please speak to your class teacher.
