After breakfast and the activities Father Christmas will enter the room to deliver presents (also included in the price).

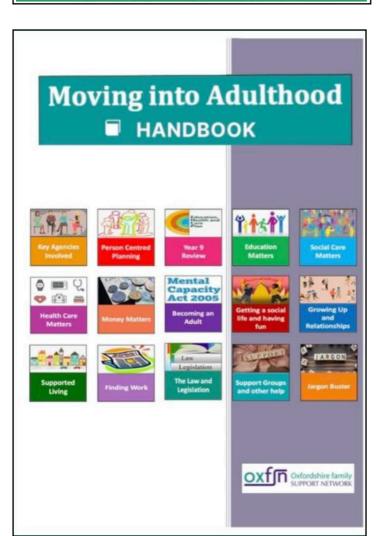

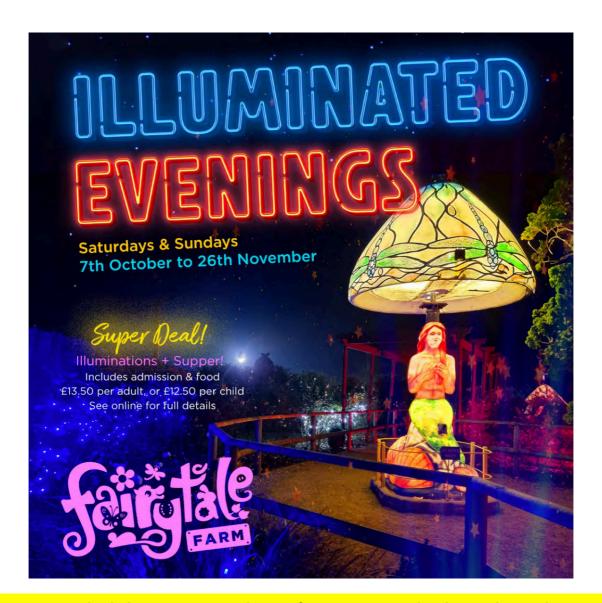

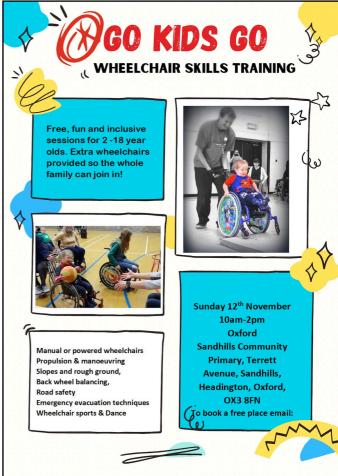

Camp Mohawk is a day centre for children with special needs and their families, set in 5 acres of beautiful countryside, just outside Wargrave, Berkshire. Throughout the year the centre provides a range of activities, facilities and natural space to encourage children with a variety of special needs to play, socialise and learn in a secure and caring environment. Our facilities include adventure playgrounds, swings, sensory garden, play village, soft play and sensory rooms, art / craft room, music room, play lounge and, in the summer months, an outdoor, heated play pool. All this is set in approximately 5 acres of natural woodland.

#### What we offer:

- Family Days in school holidays and on Saturdays in term time children / young people need to be accompanied by a parent / carer but we have a team of staff and volunteers on hand to provide support and assistance
- Short Breaks activities for children / young people aged 8 to 25 who have High Functioning Autism / Asperger's Syndrome
- Special events including sensory sensitive fireworks displays and Christmas parties
- Group sessions / days for SEND support groups, schools and groups of families





Registration is mandatory for all services and advance booking is necessary for all sessions. ## **Universal Credit migration notices**

The Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) has started sending out notice letters to people on **legacy benefits** - a benefit which is being replaced by Universal Credit - to move on to Universal Credit. It is important to note that you don't need to claim Universal Credit if you've only received a leaflet from DWP telling you to get ready for Universal Credit. Wait until you receive a letter with a deadline.

If you have received a notice letter, make sure you read what is in the letter. You shouldn't ignore this letter as it will have a deadline. The deadlines are normally three months after the date the notice letter was sent. Your legacy benefits will stop after this deadline.

It is important to make a successful claim for Universal Credit by the deadline, but the timing of that claim can be important so that you can prevent gaps between claims.

Nothing Without Us is a co-produced gallery trail that shares the lived experiences of disabled people, their stories revealed by objects in the Pitt Rivers Museum.

In the summer of 2023, the Museum's Curating for Change Fellow, Kyle Lewis Jordan, led a group of co-producers in researching disability across multiple times and spaces. Their questions grew from asking how disabled people lived throughout time, to interrogating how the objects capture the experience of disability itself. Their ideas covered themes of Form and Function, Precarity and Violence, and Care.

We invite you to reflect on how such experiences have not only shaped their lives, but have a deeper connection and meaning that matters for all of us.

There will be signs up to help you locate the areas and activities. If you need additional support, please ask a staff member who will be visible by their lanyard.

There will be a quiet area in the Lecture Room with lower lighting, bean bags, chairs and books. This area will be regularly checked by a staff member. There will also be a quiet area in the Natural History Museum in the Annex, which will be clearly signposted.

# Oxfordshire Residents Support Scheme

Details of how to apply to the Oxfordshire Resident Support Scheme, our local hardship fund

A new scheme has been launched to support residents who are either in, or at risk of being in crisis, are in need of immediate help and have no other source of financial support available to them.

### What kind of support can you get?

The Resident Support Scheme will help with short-term basic living costs such as food and credit for gas/electric prepayment meters. It can also help in some circumstances with white goods, furniture and clothing. It is intended to meet one-off crisis or emergency need and is not designed to meet any type of ongoing expenses.

Cash will not usually be awarded, but a pay point voucher (which can be redeemed for cash) or bank transfer can be supplied where necessary.

Items required, such as furniture, ovens or fridges will be purchased through the scheme and the delivery will be arranged with the resident directly to their home.

If approved, delivery of these items will be arranged within five working days. The old item will be removed, where applicable, and the new item will be installed.

The scheme will also signpost residents to other sources of support that are available to ensure that they can get the maximum level of help.

There may also be the opportunity for referral for advice/assistance with financial, debt and/or welfare benefits to try and address the resident's long-term needs.

### Who does the scheme help?

All residents aged 16 years or over are eligible to apply but the council has identified the following groups as a priority to support:

- · those experiencing or at risk of domestic abuse
- · families with young children
- older people
- people with longer-term illnesses
- people with disabilities
- · people with mental health needs
- households with a pregnant person

### What will not be awarded?

Not every application will be awarded. The scheme will not award:

- any application made that is assessed to be 'not an immediate need' or where alternative means of support is available
- applications from those with sufficient income or savings
- clothing (except in exceptional circumstances where someone is fleeing their home e.g. flood, fire, domestic violence)
- minor structural repairs where these are the responsibility of the landlord or the owner.
- furniture and household items where living in private rented furnished accommodation or furnished temporary accommodation, where this is the responsibility of the landlord
- specialist disability equipment or adaptations, recliner chairs, wheelchairs and mobility scooters
- personal debts we will refer to appropriate agencies for support.
- · phone costs or associated expenses

### How do you apply?

You can make your application to the scheme online at any time. You will need to provide information about:

- · where you live
- · who you live with
- · your circumstances
- · your income
- · your health
- · what help you are applying for

If you are unable to get online, you can use the free Wi-Fi or the free-to-access PCs in one of our 44 libraries, where staff will be happy to help.

### .How long will it take for a decision to be made?

Decisions will be made for 'cash awards' applications within one working day and for household goods within five working days. Cash applications will be paid via pay point voucher and where the code will be sent by text message or email, which will be received within 24 hours of the decision being made.

If an item is awarded, you will either receive an email or a phone call for delivery to be arranged at a time that suits the resident.

### Can I appeal a decision?

If an application is unsuccessful there is an opportunity to make an appeal. You will have 10 working days from the date of your decision letter to register your appeal. You can appeal by emailing RSSOxfordshire@necsws.com or writing to:
