A Message from the Heads

When we think about disability, we often start by thinking about "Equality". As a school we have to write a policy to capture the ways in which we are fulfilling our responsibilities towards the Equality Act, which you can read here - Equality Policy.



What we seem to talk about less is the importance of "Equity". The idea that in order to get a similar outcome or experience similar things, people need different amounts of investment, support, care and consideration.

At Frank Wise we focus a lot on equity and how we can enable our pupils to overcome the barriers to their individual successes, in order that they can grow up to become the best that they can be. To do this, in a variety of ways, some pupils need more support than others at different times during their educational journey. Whether that is from staff, opportunities to practice new skills, particular items of equipment or educational resources.

Whilst this principle underpins our way of working, we are currently being hampered by the system in which the school operates, which does not always reflect the same ambitions. For example, we are currently having to speak regularly with Oxfordshire County Council about the level of funding that we receive, which no longer reflects the costs associated with providing the education that the children who attend the school both require and deserve.

Along with the other county special schools, we have had numerous conversations highlighting that the current funding system provides a degree of equality, but little in the way of equity. This is something that we are hoping Oxfordshire County Council will resolve, in order to ensure that we are provided with what we need financially to be able to effectively deliver the equity your children need.

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IST GAMENY GROUP DESIGN RECENCESY MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS









This term the children in IFG have been given the challenge of designing and constructing instruments that they can 'Bang', 'Shake' and/or 'Pluck'. The children were given the opportunity to explore instruments they could 'Bang', 'Shake' and 'Pluck' at the start of each session before being presented with a selection of recycled materials from which they could make their own instrument. Emphasis was placed on the sound the chosen materials produced, such as a 'Quiet' or 'Loud' sound, and the robustness of the materials. After Quite a few attempts at selecting the most suitable materials for the task, a version of a drum, shaker and instrument they could pluck were produced.










5FG Music



We have been learning to read musical notes and say whether they are worth 1, 2 or 4 beats. Can you match the Numicon pieces to the correct musical note?

We have been exploring a range of instruments and the sounds they make and identifying instruments by their sound.





We have been learning to name lots of different instruments. We have been learning to categorise instruments into two groups; 'tuned' and 'percussion'.



Percussion instruments are good for keeping a beat. *Most* percussion instruments are not good for playing a melody or tune. Different percussion instruments make different sounds. Some examples of percussion instruments are:

- Drums
- Cymbals
- Claves
- Triangle
- Glockenspiel

Tuned instruments are good for playing a melody or tune. Some instruments are wind instruments. You blow into them to make the sound. Some instruments are stringed. You have to make the strings vibrate to make the sound. Some examples are:


- Piano




Making the diver dive! Magic? No . . . more super science!

Lots of ripping, glue and concentration to fill our shapes with pieces of maps.




