We also looked in detail at different types of fastening and handles. The children then explored what sort of bag they wanted to make and who they would like to make them for. A paper template of the bag was made, including where the handles and pocket needed to be attached. The children then chose the fabric they wished to use, and were encouraged to consider whether it would be strong enough to hold items such as toys or a book. Their chosen the fabric was cut out using the original template as a guide, and then it was then stitched using a sewing machine and a needle and thread.











In 3FG this term, we have been reading the book, You Choose by Pippa Goodhart! We have been making and creating our very own You Choose booklets based off of this story!



Gabriel stayed behind to clean and tidy up, afterwards, because it was his classroom job.
































10FG Design and Technology - Textiles

10FG have been learning about fabric waste and the impact this is having on our environment.

They have been learning some ways in which we can reduce fabric waste, and they have found that we can do that in three ways:

Reduce - Reuse - Recycle









In the classroom 10FG researched a range of products made from old fabric and the pupils chose one that they were interested in. They used Youtube tutorials to learn how to achieve their goals and wrote their own instructions. Then, they made a list of what they would need to create our products. They hopped back on the bus and bought some items from a charity shop. They also walked to the fabric shop to buy some sewing essentials. One of the ways in which we can recycle old fabrics is by turning them into something new. This can also be called up-cycling.

The pupils have been using their new bus passes to go on the bus to town. They visited the eco shop in Castle Quay to talk about sustainable living and research some products which are made from waste materials.



The pupils used scissors to cut their fabric and then a range of methods to join them including a hand held sewing machine, needle and thread and fabric glue. They could press the button on the machine to make it work and pull the fabric through, working with a partner. They found that sewing was the best way to join the fabric together, but glue worked well for the embellishments.







The pupils chose different methods of fastening their products including velcro and zips. Some products didn't need a fastening such as a tote bag.

The pupils tried out their products and evaluated them against their own success criteria. The products needed to be fit for purpose, for example a PE bag needed to hold a PE kit, and a pillowcase had to be soft and fit a pillow inside.

10FG researched what their products might sell for on a site like Etsy, and worked out how much profit they could make by deducting what they spent from the potential earnings. They talked about how making something to sell could be a good way of making money.











10FG were really proud of their finished products and were keen to share them with their classmates. They are hoping to re-embark on this process so that they can put their findings from their evaluations back into practice on another product!
