And yet it isn't always those staff who get the acknowledgements at keys points such as the end of the school year.

So we just wanted to give you a bit of a break down of the key functions that they all provide and let you know just how appreciated they are



## The Office

These are the people who ensure that all of our systems run smoothly and are often your first point of contact with the school. They also make sure that we have all of the resources we need, as well as helping us to manage an increasingly challenging budget. They are also the SLT's safety net, making sure that we don't drop any of the multiple balls we are often juggling.

### The Pool

The pool staff make sure that your children can swim in an amazingly clean and well maintained pool, but more importantly they have the expertise necessary to ensure that when the children are doing their swimming lessons we have well targeted ambitious aims, so we can enable every child to do their best.

## **The Midday Carers**

This group of staff come in every day to support at lunch time and help with the teaching of the independence skills associated with eating, using the toilet and playing successfully. Their impact on the school is significantly greater than the time they spend here, and many of them also back us up in the classroom when we have other staff off ill.

### The Cooks

Each day the staff from BGN come in to make sure that all the pupils are well fed and have food that meets their dietary and textual requirements. They do a wonderful job of ensuring that the pupils who have school dinners start the afternoon well fuelled.

### The Site Manager

Our site manager keeps an eye on the health and safety of the building and the general maintenance, as well as fixing things which unexpectedly break, even when staff forget to tell him!! He also coordinates the contractors for the larger projects to make sure that everything goes smoothly.

### **IT Support**

Our IT expert does increasing amounts of work remotely, and is always on the end of the phone if we have an unexpected tech issue or a computer stops working for some reason. He keeps our creaking devices running and our expenditure down.

## **The Minibus Team**

Picking up and dropping off those children who come to school on the FWS bus is only part of their role. They also keep the buses looking their best, topped up with fuel and complete the regular checks on oil levels and screen wash etc.

### **The Cleaners**

The team at Clean Genie arrive every day to make sure that when the staff and pupils arrive in the morning the school is looking spick and span. They also come in to do deep cleans of specific areas to make sure we have a hygienic school to work in.

### **The Health Teams**

Staff from the NHS support us with physio, occupational therapy and speech and language therapy, as well as supporting the wider health needs of the pupils and providing routine clinics for those who are on the various clinical case loads. They also sometimes work to support the attendance of individual children.

Without all of these contributions, the school would not be the organisation that it is and those of us in teaching roles would not be able to do the work we do to the high standards we expect. So we just wanted to say a big thank you to everyone who helps us to be the school we are.
































## Light in 2FG

















## TOWN AND COUNTRY EXPLORATION in 5FG

Over the course of the summer term 7FG have visited lots of locations within our local community!
















We have been to the Banbury fire station, Warriner Farm, Dogs For Good, Banbury Train Station, litter picking and Tadmarten to visit the horses!

WE KNOW THAT IF WE PLACE A CAR ON A GLOPE THEN IT WILL ROLL DOWN, DUE TO GRAVITY.







## DROWNING PREVENTION WEEK




This term we got involved with the RLSS Drowning Prevention Week. We had fun in the pool learning how to keep safe in and around water!
